WDFH 90.3 reignites “In Focus” show for local news analysis

Westchester’s community station, WDFH 90.3 FM, has relaunched “In Focus,” its weekly interview show covering politics, arts, culture and commercial development in the lower Hudson River Valley.

Ossining (WDFH) November 19, 2008 – “In Focus” returns to the air at WDFH as weekly half-hour conversations with Gary Cahill, editor and publisher of The Gazette. The Gazette is a weekly paper that covers Ossining, Briarcliff Manor, Cortlandt, and Croton-on-Hudson, NY.

“Gary seems to be everywhere,” said Jane Botticelli, co-host of the program. “He covers board meetings, local arts events and local business openings. He’s been reporting on the lower Hudson valley for 32 years and his knowledge is encyclopedic.”

Co-host Vinny Cohan added, “Gary Cahill’s extensive knowledge about the social and political history of our communities provides a rich context for our discussions of local news.”

The station broadcasts “In Focus” Monday evening at 6:30 pm, following “Free Speech Radio News,” and repeats it on Wednesday morning at 7:30 am, just before “Democracy Now!” Each show is also available online at wdfh.org.

This week, Ms. Botticelli and Mr. Cahill discuss political campaign shenanigans in Ossining and an indictment for a local environmental testing firm. Someone mailed a pre-election flyer appearing to support a candidate for Ossining Town Supervisor, but misrepresented her views. Who was behind the mailing? Did it violate the federal laws governing mail? Also, an established environmental testing company located in Ossining has been indicted along with 12 individuals connected with the firm for possibly falsifying test results or failing to performing testing for various building projects – including the Freedom Tower in Manhattan.
